LCEE is a Welsh Government A4B funded Knowledge Exchange Project being run out of Aberystwyth University, whose main objective is:

To establish a multi-disciplinary network from academia and industry to identify priorities, opportunities and barriers associated with sustainable resource management, renewable energy and bio-based products and services in Wales.

This upcoming event is an opportunity to get away from the office and lab to explore collaborative links and develop interdisciplinary research ideas in the area of Low Carbon Energy and the Environment.

The workshop will be run as an Open Space meeting (see below) and is open to all those already working in the area of low carbon energy and environment or those with no current research activities in the area but who have a desire to engage with the low carbon agenda in Wales.

The aim of this event is to contribute to a roadmap of the major barriers and opportunities for research and enterprise in the low carbon sector in Wales. It is hoped that the event will facilitate the development of real multidisciplinary project proposals, and will benefit from the presence of representatives from the Welsh Government representatives who can advise on relevant funding opportunities.

For those preferring to travel up the night before (2nd October), we have organised dinner, accommodation and a meeting room for open networking (registration by 5pm).

Attendance for both days is free and includes meals and, if arriving on the 2nd October, accommodation at Gregynog Hall.

Briefly, Open Space meetings have no formal agenda beyond the overall theme, in this case Low Carbon Energy and the Environment: towards a low carbon economy for Wales. They begin with participants raising issues that will set a working agenda for the day and will result in a series of breakout sessions, with participants free to join in with those most relevant or interesting to them. In this way, the issues that are most important to people will be discussed and the issues raised will be addressed by the participants best capable of getting something done about them.
